
Cambridge International Foundation School:




been using it for decades.

So onward, driven by the spark, we forge a world, no longer dark. Through science, hope and endless quests, humanity continues to its very best.




Rise of the Meme Sahaan Pulhani


Interviewer: That's really impressive! Did you face any issues while writing your book?

Today, we look at how this amazing realm continuously shapes our reality.

Aviation is linked not simply to distances but also to economies and cultures. Imagine sushi in Tokyo and flamenco in São Paulo. While budget flights today help to make overseas travel accessible, the 'jet set' era of the 1960s made travel desirable. Economies depend on aviation; travel accounts for one in ten people globally, and air cargo makes up 35% of all trade by value. Vaccines and e-commerce products can be transported by aviation, therefore maintaining the momentum of modern life.

In the future, we can expect a calm, emission-free aerial taxi flying over traffic. Companies like Joby Aviation and Lilium are realizing this science fiction dream by running tests in Los Angeles and Seoul.

In Rwanda, drones deliver drugs and survey woodlands impacted by climate change. Concurrent with this, space tourist companies like SpaceX hint at a time when "aviation" will transcend Earth. Once a limit, the heavens are now a road.

Aviation shows that limitations are supposed to be tested. Every launch is a strong statement of human capability. 



Recipe for a Revolution Yuvraj Arora

- 1 megaphone, to taste



- 3. Turn up the heat Introduce your idea to the public, using your megaphone (or social media) to amplify your voice. Be prepared for resistance—controversy can add spice, but too much can burn the whole dish.
- 4. Let it simmer Change doesn't happen overnight. Stir the conversation, feed the momentum, and adjust the seasoning as needed.
- 5. Taste-test and adjust If the revolution isn't gaining traction, tweak the messaging. Add a pinch more urgency, a spoonful of clarity, or a splash of storytelling to make it more digestible.
- 6. Serve while hot Timing is everything. When the moment is right, dish it out with confidence and watch the world take a bite.

Chef's advice: Some revolutions are sweet, some are bitter, and some leave a lasting after-taste. No matter the outcome, a well-cooked revolution always changes the flavor of history.
